

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### Risky Business on Rag Trade

This article by Dr Muhammad Faisol Chowdhury was published in the 26th issue of 'The Mint - Fresh Thinking in Economics', a UK magazine on economics and global politics, published by the British think tank Promoting Economic Pluralism. The article provides fascinating insights into how workplace safety becomes a trifle when the survival of factory workers is at stake in apparel producer and supplier factories in Bangladesh that work within the global supply chain network.

Dr Faisol mentions that over the past decade, he had overseen these issues within numerous apparel supplier factories, and the steps taken by the authorities. Despite improvements, a significant gap existed between Western safety standards and local interpretations. Moreover, workers, under pressure to meet targets and earn a living wage, often prioritize overtime, compromising safety. Additionally, the article highlights overlooked everyday safety concerns, such as violence against female workers challenging gender norms and the perils of commuting in a region notorious for road accidents. At the very end, he underscores the need for supply chain actors to grasp these ground realities to address safety lapses and improve working conditions effectively.

### Headlines Vs Hemlines: The Pervasive Bias of Entertainment Journalism Against Women

This article by Tabassum Islam, published in The Daily Star, highlighted the deep-rooted biases in entertainment journalism where women's personal choices and appearances often overshadow their professional accomplishments.

Using examples spanning from Dhaka to Hollywood, the article underscored how female artists' attires or personal lives become more significant than their achievements. Based on theories of media studies and cultural theories, it suggested this skewed representation stems from a blend of societal values and media sensationalism.

Moreover, the article highlighted the relevance of media studies' historical portrayal of women through a 'dual lens of admiration and moral policing', perpetuating stereotypes that impact public perception.

It also inquired into the entertainment journalism's shift from 'bad news sells' to 'scandal sells' globally which exploited personal aspects of female artists for increased readership, driven by economic motives, advocating for increased gender diversity in newsrooms, urging media stakeholders to recalibrate their perspectives and celebrate the genuine contributions of women in entertainment.



Lastly, the article emphasises that editors, journalists, and decision-makers should take the lead by embracing diversity, fostering substantive discussions and specifying the need for a shift in focus towards recognising and celebrating women's talents beyond superficial scrutiny.

## Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership: Bangladesh In Rcep: How Can It Benefit Us?

The article by Tamanna Tabassum and Azmaeen Muhammad Nibras, published in The Business Standard, presented a comprehensive overview of Bangladesh's economic trajectory. Highlighting the nation's ambitious goal to become the 25th largest global economy by 2035, Ms Tabassum and Mr Nibras underscored the strategic imperative of Bangladesh's plan to graduate from Least Developed Country status by 2026 and join the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP). Moreover, they emphasised the potential benefits, and the importance of Preferential Trade Agreements and Free Trade Agreements for sustained competitiveness, advocating for export market diversification, particularly towards rapidly growing ASEAN economies. Furthermore, they explored the benefits of joining the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) Bangladesh which enables unified trading access and entry to a vast market. Following this, the article also highlighted that RCEP offers Bangladesh economic advantages with a 90% zero-tariff projection, improved South Asian marketplace access, and potential FDI, emphasizing the strategic benefits of membership.

Failure to join may necessitate complex bilateral agreements, while RCE's appeal could prompt India to reassess its position, highlighting the pivotal significance of Bangladesh's potential entry.

Joining the world's largest free trading block known as the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) has become imperative to accelerate the country's resilient track record of growth dynamics

The article also mentioned the major challenges that Bangladesh might face are Zero tariffs in RCEP that threaten local industries but also boost competition and product improvement.



### Redefining The "shape" of Things To Come: A Case Study on Marketing a Taboo Product And Averting a Potential Crisis

The case by Rumana Liza Anam, published in The Case Journal by Emerald Publishing explores the challenges faced by 'Shape', a private limited company in Bangladesh, specialising in undergarments and women's products. Through interviews with founder Monoshita Ayruani, it explores the challenges of marketing in a conservative society, addressing crises linked to cultural sensitivities and protests against Western influences, making it a valuable case for Marketing or International Business courses.

According to the article, Shape produces and sells "innerwear" or undergarments, which are their staple products, as well as clothing, bath products, sleepwear, and various other products targeted at women. Starting as an online business in 2019, during the COVID-19 pandemic hit, the problem faced by Shape at the beginning was that digital marketing was not resulting in word of mouth for the product, as undergarments were considered too 'taboo' to talk or share about with most people. Moreover, the author addresses a second problem faced, which was the sudden protests about Westernised clothing and culture in 2022, which potentially threatened the company. The author also explores international supply chain problems, which can be taught in an International Business course.



Lastly, she also mentioned that this case is well suited for an undergraduate or graduate-level Marketing or Strategic Management course that exposes students to the challenges of promoting a new brand and marketing taboo products imported from abroad, in a largely conservative and culturally sensitive market, and preventing a potential crisis when protests break out.

Mohammad Tawhid Reaz, Sr. Lecturer & EMBA Program Coordinator of the School of Business virtually presented his research paper "The Impact of Colour Vision Defects on Travel Destination Selection" at The International Conference on Social Science & Technology (ICOSST 2023 organized by the University Kuala Lumpur Malaysian Institute of Information Technology (UniKL MIIT), 21st September 2023. As it was a Scopus conference, all the accepted conference papers will be published in the Scopus journal/book chapter in 2024.

Colour Vision Defect or Color Blindness is the PhD topic of Mohammad Tawhid Reaz. He is doing PhD research on "The Impact of Colour Vision Defect on Product Purchase Decision and Brand Perception of Physical Retail Customers in Bangladesh" at Asia Pacific University of Innovation and Technology, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. He has already published a Scopus Book Chapter on Color Blindness-related research paper in Springer Nature this year.

In this research work presented in ICOSST-2023, co-authors were Dr. Morakinyo Dada, Dr. James Jacob Ribero and ULAB Lecturer Nazmun Nur Eva.

The purpose of this paper is to analyze the impact of colour vision defects on travellers and hence the tourism industry of Bangladesh.



As previous research suggests the prevalence of colour vision defects (CVD) in Bangladesh is 3.35% (male - 8.04%, female - 0.66%), the study seeks to investigate how the CVD affected travellers perceive travel destinations and what the impact on the tourism industry is the key purpose of this study. A lab test using 557 samples determined the prevalence of colour vision defects (CVD). Hypothesis, paired, and correlation testing were conducted on all respondents. Results indicate that CVD has an insignificant impact on overall travel destination selection, though a significant difference was found between normal vision and CVD-affected individuals. While the direct impact on the tourism sector is limited, industries prioritising colour may be affected. The research outcome is intriguing and warrants further analysis for tourism authorities or government decision-makers.

According to research, colour Vision Defect affects about one in twelve males and two hundred women worldwide. CVD has a big impact in almost every marketing and branding circumstance, especially when product colour is the key.



This study began with a Red-Green CVD test of 522 Dhaka residents. Since few research have measured colour blindness in Banaladesh, this study can be used as one of the Bangladesh colour vision deficiency baseline results. The important factor of this study is whether this result is comparable to Bangladesh's earlier result and whether Bangladesh has a lower/higher CVD prevalence than other nations. The most common CVD is a Red-Green Colour Vision Defect. Green fruits turn vellow and red when maturing and CVD patients have trouble distinguishing neighbouring colours like Red, Green, Brown, etc. After examining baskets of green and ripe yellow, red, and partly reddish fruits, this study evaluated the findings. This study found that people with colour vision defects had trouble choosing fruits from baskets. Furthermore, the study tested hypotheses to determine the severity of Red-Green CVD and found it to be less than expected probably due to coping mechanisms, experience etc. in Red-Green CVD subjects.





## 30th International Vincentian Business Ethics Conference, Ireland

Associate Professor and BBA Program Director Dr Muhammad Faisol Chowdhury presented his research paper titled 'Managerial Interpretations of Safety Governance Mechanisms Enacted in Factories of Global Supply Chains' at the 30th International Vincentian Business Ethics Conference (IVBEC) held at Dublin City University, Ireland. 'New Frontier in Business Ethics' was this year's conference theme.

With reference to the life and service of St Vincent De Paul (1581-1660) to the poor, this yearly conference incorporates a Vincentian theology of business ethics, and yet, it embraces scholars from all religious traditions and none. Launched in 1993, the three American Vincentian Universities—DePaul University, Niagara University, and St. John's University—embarked on a tradition of bringing ethical issues pertaining to business and its relationship to society, with a goal of





At the conference, Dr Chowdhury addressed the managerial attitudes held toward the institutional safety governance mechanisms enacted in apparel factories of global supply chains. He argued that such attitudes can be explored through owner-managers' interpretations of such mechanisms, which are required by various institutional actors, e.g., global buyers, international social compliance authorities, labour confederations, and foreign and local governments. His research uncovered interesting managerial interpretations of institutional safety governance mechanisms, indicating both compliant and discontented attitudes and leaving scope for further empirical investigations aimed at exploring managerial responses to institutional demands for workplace safety.









## Demand For Online Master's Program Among Bangladeshi Undergrad Students

Mr Faisal Mohammad Shahriar, Assistant Professor and Coordinator of the BBA Program along with the main author Prof. Dr Jahirul Haque, Vice Chancellor of the Canadian University of Bangladesh, and coauthor Monjur Chowdhury, Teacher at Sabtuan Adult Education Services, Cree School Board in Canada, presented this research at the international conference organised by Business and Applied Sciences Academy of North America (BAASANA) in New York, USA. This paper explored the existing inclination of undergraduate students in Bangladesh, especially in Social Sciences, Engineering, Business, and Humanities, who are leaning towards online master's degrees to meet job market needs, despite challenges from conservative regulatory constraints in the country.

A huge number of university students who are doing undergraduate degree programs at this point will go for their master's degree after completion of their current programs, as most corporate houses in Bangladesh do not recruit entry-level officials without a master's degree. Therefore, students with different undergraduate backgrounds will go for their master's degree programs to be eligible for the said job market. Nowadays, doing an online master's degree from any part of the world is a great option, although, this opportunity in Bangladesh is limited because



of the conservative approach of our regulatory bodies and for the lack of acceptance of online degrees by our elder generations. So, a survey has been conducted among the students of some top non-government and government universities of Bangladesh to know the demand for online master's degrees at this point. Students from Schools of Social Sciences, Engineering, Business, and Humanities participated in this survey. The study is an attempt to understand students' mindset toward online master's degree programs.



### The Promises And Challenges of Dental Tourism In South Asia

Dr Umana Anjalin, Associate Professor of Marketing presented this research at the '2023 International Hybrid Conference' organised by the Business and Applied Sciences Academy of North America (BAASANA) in New York, USA. The other two co-authors of the paper were Dr Abu Saleh Md. Sohel-Uz-Zaman, Professor HRM at United International University, Bangladesh and Dr Abhijit Mazumdar, Assistant Professor of Journalism at Park University, USA. This research investigated the overlooked importance of oral health, particularly among international students, comparing exorbitant dental costs in Western countries to those in South Asia, and highlighting the potential of South Asia as a dental tourism hub.

It is a concern that many people often ignore oral health for uncanny and mysterious reasons!

Strangely enough, people would never forget any infection in any other body part, yet they often close their eyes to oral cavity infection! Research unequivocally demonstrates a closely synchronous relationship between medical and dental conditions. Nonetheless, many people worldwide also ignore proper dental care regimens that they deserve to be rather serious about. This research would reflect the international students' concerns regarding the exorbitant costs of oral health check-ups in Western countries and simultaneously compare that to the South Asian country



Bangladesh, for example, and side by side lay out the prospects of dental tourism in the countries of South Asia. Various dental treatment costs will be compared between the Western and the Eastern regions like the USA, the UK and, Bangladesh, India, and discuss the prospects and problems of dental treatment in both areas. Finally, the paper shall highlight South Asia as a promising dental tourism hub. The research will seek data from expatriates, immigrants from South Asian countries, international students, and other international dental patients through interviews, document analysis, and market surveys.





### How Academic Leadership Assisted Students To Cope-up With Campus-based Teaching, Learning And Assessment In The Post-covid Period: The Case of Two Private Universities In Dhaka, Bangladesh

Mr Faisal Mohammad Shahriar, Assistant Professor and Coordinator of the BBA Program along with the main author Prof. Dr Jahirul Haque, Vice Chancellor of the Canadian University of Bangladesh, presented this research paper at the Asia Pacific Conference, in Beppu, Japan. The other co-author of the paper was Faisal Mohammad Shahriar, Assistant Professor of the ULAB BBA Program. This paper explores post-COVID challenges in two Dhaka-based private universities, emphasising visionary leadership at top levels and initiatives taken to support students in readjusting to campus life and achieving academic apals.

After nearly two years of online operations during the COVID-19 pandemic, the universities of Bangladesh have re-opened their campus in early 2022. However, coping with campus-based teaching, learning, and assessment has been a significant challenge for the students due to the deep impact of the pandemic on their lifestyle and mindset, which altered radically during this time. To overcome the inertia of the long gap, re-orient with campus life, and perform satisfactorily in assessments, students needed strong support from the top administration, program-level management, and faculties of their respective institutions.

The unique nature of the situation called for unprecedented academic leadership from these corners. This paper focuses on the visionary leadership demonstrated by the people of these three levels in two private universities in Dhaka namely the Canadian University of Banaladesh and the University of Liberal Arts Bangladesh in the post-COVID period. The paper provides a highlight of the key initiatives and strategies taken within the two institutions to ensure a supportive environment and path to re-orientation for the students to campus activities without putting too much stress on them; ensure acceptable performance, and attain teaching-learning objectives at program levels. Key administrative personnel, departmental administrators, faculties, and students were interviewed to generate benchmark information on the subject matter. The study represents the endeavour of most private universities committed to achieving excellence in academia.

His paper addressed the growing importance of environmental, social, and governance factors in the sustainability of financial institutions, with a specific focus on traditional banks and micro-finance institutions. By employing the Preferred Reporting Items for Systematic Reviews and Meta-Analyses (PRISMA) protocol, the research integrated data from the Web of Science and Scopus databases, conducting a comprehensive systematic literature review.

The contribution of the work has received appreciation from international reviewers and participants in the conference. Notably, this paper is the outcome of a research project funded by the ULAB and United International University.







Currently, this paper is under review in an indexed, international-reviewed journal for possible publication.

Following his conference presentation,
Dr Shamsuddin actively engaged in discussions with the Director of GLIM to explore potential collaborations between GLIM and ULAB. Professor Dr Sarwar Uddin Ahmed, Dean of ULAB School of Business, also joined the meeting virtually. Both institutions have agreed to collaborate on student and faculty exchanges, along with organising workshops and study visits. This collaborative initiative signifies a forward-thinking partnership, dedicated to mutual growth and the enhancement of academic excellence for both GLIM and ULAB.










### Seminar on "Growing a Local Business Amongst Global Competition In Bangladesh -The Experience of Chillox"



In every term, the ULAB BBA Program organises an information-sharing session for its students who are going to choose their study concentration areas. The BBA Program offers five study concentrations, Accounting, Finance, Human Resource Management, Marketing, and Supply Chain Management, for its students to choose from, to ensure a market-ready education that aligns with students' personal interests and career goals. In the first two years of BBA, students are expected to complete the set Core and GED courses to build a solid foundation in the functional areas of business and the global environment. Beginning in their third year, students get the option to specialise in one of the five concentrations.

This term, the concentration declaration session was held online in October. The session started with a brief introduction by the BBA Director and Associate Professor Dr Muhammad Faisol Chowdhury. He emphasised that students should always choose a concentration that interests them most, not because of high job demands. Jobs are available for each of these concentrations but the motivation to choose a concentration should originate within oneself.

Assistant Professor Mr Wazir A F Ahmad started by presenting Accounting, followed by Senior Lecturer Liliping presenting Finance, Assistant Professor Abdul Baten presenting Human Resource Management, Senior Lecturer Tazrian Shainam Shahid presenting Marketing,



and Senior Lecturer Shawkat Tanveer Rahman presenting Supply Chain Management. Each of them discussed the current market demands and future career prospects of the concentrations they represented.

The BBA Program, for the first time, introduced Economics which can be taken as a Minor by BBA and students from all other degree programs at ULAB from Spring 2024. ## Exploring Google Classroom For Dynamic Learning For BBA Faculty







The imperative shift towards renewable energy was highlighted, with him shedding light on upcoming government projects in Bangladesh. Despite the potential of solar power, he acknowledged the significant challenge of acquiring suitable land due to the country's overpopulation, planning limitations, and bureaucracy.

Encouraging aspiring professionals, Mr Rahman advocated for courses related to renewable energy, emphasising that degrees at various levels could pave the way into the energy sector. He addressed the influx of foreign manpower and



the need to focus on developing a skilled workforce within Bangladesh. At the end of the session, Mr Baten extended gratitude to Arif Zaman and facilitated a Q&A session for students, particularly focusing on the promising prospects for electrical and mechanical engineering graduates. 

## BBA Internship/Project Defence Grooming & Job Searching Fall 2023



### **Session 1: Deconstructing Doctoral Research**

Organised by the ULAB BBA Program Monday, 6 November 2023



The ULAB BBA Program initiated the Brown Bag series for the first time in November 2023. These are informal online sessions for BBA colleagues to share their knowledge and thoughts on various topics such as dissemination of research, preparation for doctoral studies and publication, faculty development, grant writing, teaching pedagogy, current affairs, or any other topic deemed suitable, for faculty development.

The first session was delivered by Assistant Professor Dr Kazi M Tarique where he presented a summary of his PhD thesis on developing and validating an objective-based performance measurement index for Islamic banks. In the discussion, Dr Tarique's PhD explored the realm of Islamic banking and created an evaluation framework rooted in the objectives of Islamic Law, known as Magasid al-Shari'ah.

Dr. Tarique talked about the foundation for a prototype evaluation model which initially underwent refinement through twelve in-depth interviews involving Shari'ah scholars and banking experts. Following this he mentioned the validation through a focus group discussion that included inputs from academics and Islamic banking practitioners. Moreover, he also revealed that the researchers have employed the Analytic Hierarchy Process (AHP) to prioritise Maqasid variables, items, and sub-items. A diverse group of thirty respondents, comprising industry experts, Shari'ah scholars, and academics, participated in his project.



His thesis further reflected on the objectives of Islamic Law, known as Maqasid al-Shari'ah that are followed by the Islamic banks. The index he developed in his research can help policymakers and bankers see if Islamic banks are in line with these objectives. In a practical test, some Islamic banks in Malaysia and Bangladesh were ranked using this index. RHB Islamic Bank in Malaysia came out on top, showing that Malaysian Islamic banks performed better than those in Bangladesh. Overall, the session provided faculty members insights on how the proposed tool evaluates Islamic banks' performance and demonstrates their alignment with Maqasidal-Shari'ah goals.

### Session 2: Discussion on Active Learning



Organised by the ULAB BBA Program Monday, 11 December 2023



Promoting Economic Pluralism (PEP), a British think tank organised an online talk show with Dr Muhammad Faisol Chowdhury, Associate Professor and Director of the ULAB's BBA Programme. 'Zoom Jams', as they are labelled, are monthly online talk shows organised by PEP to provide opportunities for connecting and interacting with the contributors of PEP's quarterly magazine 'The Mint'. In PEP's recent Zoom Jam, Dr Chowdhury provided valuable insights on how workplace safety becomes a sideshow when the survival of factory workers is at stake in Bangladeshi apparel manufacturing factories.

The talk show was moderated by Henry Leveson-Gower, a British Economist and the Editor of The Mint. In the talk, Dr Chowdhury answered to questions asked by the invited guests. He elaborated on the contextual factors influencing the factory safety behaviours of the workers. The main message was the poor socioeconomic characteristics of workers' livelihoods which influence their attitude towards workplace safety.

Issues such as economic hardship, risky commuting, domestic violence, substandard accommodation, lack of access to healthcare, and no social security, were highlighted to relate workers' attitude towards industrial risks and workplace safety.



Dr Chowdhury concluded that when factory workers regularly struggle to make ends meet and lead lives in which their basic human rights are ignored on a daily basis and safety at home is non-existent, safety at work becomes a lesser concern. The talk show was attended by British academics and economists who have a particular interest in trade and economic issues of the global south.

Dr Minhaz opined that a significant influx of Chinese citizens into Bangladesh involved in higher education and employment presents the possibility of a heightened bilateral relationship. The 3rd South and Southeast Asian University Presidents Forum has opened new avenues for such a relationship, underscoring the growing ties between Bangladesh and China on educational and cultural fronts.

### Interview of a Faculty Member

### 1. What motivated you to choose ULAB as your workplace, especially after your experiences in the banking sector and studying abroad?

After working for a couple of years in the banking sector, I realized that I didn't want to pursue my career further in the sector. I felt that I was not being able to create much impact in transforming society. Moreover, I had religious motivations as well to take leave from the sector. Considering the matter of having a greater impact on transforming our society, I decided to pursue my career in academia. So, I went abroad for higher studies.

After returning, I applied to a couple of universities including my alma mater. However, ULAB was the first to offer me a job. I really liked ULAB's approach towards integrating liberal arts education into the curriculum, which I learned during my interview. Furthermore, I got to know from my acquaintances that ULAB is one of the few institutions that offer a great work environment. Thus, I decided to start my journey with ULAB and it has been an excellent decision.

### 2. How has your transition from the banking industry to academia influenced your teaching and interaction with students?

I started my banking career as a management trainee. During the first year, we went through extensive training programs at the Bangladesh Institute of Administration and Management (BIAM) as well as the Bangladesh Institute of Bank Management (BIBM). Besides, we also had to go through job rotations in all the departments of the bank, which helped to gain a holistic view of the banking business.

After the trainee period, I was selected to work in credit risk management, which allowed me to gain insight into different sectors and companies. This experience has been invaluable as I can draw upon real-world cases from local sectors and companies when teaching a topic. Moreover, I occasionally had to provide on-the-job training to new joiners and new batches of management trainees as well as probationary officers. This allowed me to brush up on my teaching, understand the psychology of learners and adapt the ongoing interaction accordingly, which has been quite helpful in my academic career. Due to my experience in providing on-the-job training, my teaching has been more inclined towards practicality compared to theory.

### 3. In your view, what unique opportunities does ULAB BBA provide for the faculty members and students?

ULAB BBA Program organizes seminars, workshops and training for the faculty members as a part of their professional development. Faculty members are encouraged to carry out consultancy for business firms or institutions, which allows them to broaden their resources and enrich their teaching. Furthermore, they are encouraged to carry out research and publish in reputed journals. The program always inspires the faculty members to come up with innovative ideas in terms of teaching, process reengineering and knowledge sharing.

The program offers a unique curriculum for the students that is focused on active learning, innovation, recent business cases and industry practices.

Besides, students enrolled in this program do their minor in non-business areas such as sustainable development, computer science, media studies, journalism, economics etc. This enables the students to enhance their knowledge base and opens up the path to diverse career choices but eventually exposes students to a variety of disciplines such as literature, history and science. Moreover, a good portion of the faculty pool in ULAB BBA Program brings along vast industry knowledge due to their previous experience. This enables the creation of a perfect blend of theory and practice enhancing student learning.

### 4. Could you share a memorable experience or a particular success story from your time teaching at ULAB?

I have been involved with the Event Management Team for quite some time, so I have been engaged with various events. However, my most notable experience was outside the Event Management Team. Back in July 2021, I was nominated to work in collaboration with Aspen Capital Solutions of USA and coordinate online training sessions for ULAB students on a bookkeeping app developed by their team. ULAB was one of the two universities in Bangladesh that collaborated with Aspen. Students attended the training sessions conducted by resource persons from Aspen for two months and attended an online test. 21 students from ULAB qualified for the certificate and we organized a certificate awarding ceremony, where the Managing Partner of Aspen was present. The news was featured in several national dailies.

I receive regular newsletters and alumni updates from Aston University, UK where I pursued my Master's.
